Surprises at 2009 California Mille

I he 19th annual California Mille held Sunday, April 26, had a few surprises for the hundreds of car fans, Nob Hill Association members and neighbors who attended. The basic Mille stayed the same, of course. Vintage sports cars buffs from all over California showed off their cars all across Nob Hill: in Huntington Park, in front of the Fairmont Hotel and on side streets all around the hill. The annual Mille Sunday reception, a benefit for the Nob Hill Association, unites an international group of rare sports racing and production cars dating from 1927 through 1957 for a 1000 miles journey through Northern California patterned after the world-famous Italian "Mille Miglia," which ran from 1927 through 1957 from Brescia in the North of Italy to Rome and back.

Everyone is invited to view the cars, taking photos and asking questions, even sitting in the cars when the owners approve. But in addition to this free event, hundreds of friends of Nob Hill and of Huntington Park contribute generously to benefit the Nob Hill Association's efforts to beautify all of Nob

Hill and preserve its history. The event netted \$10,000 for the maintenance and improvement of the park.



This year, unlike years past, the sumptuous Italian buffet and reception was moved into the Fairmont Hotel into the beautiful Gold Room. Hosted by the Fairmont and its regional manager, Tom Klein, guests sipped on bloody Marys, fine California wines and dined on an exquisite Italian buffet prepared by the fine chefs at the Fairmont. Additionally, exciting raffle prizes were offered courtesy of the Fairmont Hotels & Resorts.

And if the car show and reception weren't enough, this year featured a legendary San Francisco personality, Kjell Qvale, owner of San Francisco's British Motors (Jaguar, Land Rover, Lamborghini, Bentley, Lotus) who mingled with the guests and signed copies of a book he has written about his colorful life, "I Never Look Back." Although Kjell is almost 90 years old, he was happy to pose for pictures in front of the two cars, a Jaguar and a Bentley, that he had brought into the Gold Room for the occasion. Qvale donated all proceeds from the sale of his book that day to the Nob Hill Foundation.

This was truly one of the best California Mille's ever. Special thanks go to Chair Bella Farrow and her Assistant Chair, Fran Hildebrand, as well as the Co-Chairs Tom Klein, Lois Lehrman and Martin Swig.

Tools For Peace Mandala Project

Grace Cathedral and Tools For Peace, a Tibetan-based nonprofit, host an incredible week-long special event, the Mandala Project, whose mission is to provide practical methods to cultivate compassion, peace, and well-being. Schoolchildren from four Bay Area schools will spend five afternoons (September 21 to 25) creating a Community Sand Mandala in the cathedral, alongside a traditional Sand Mandala created by Tibetan Lamas. Mandalas are ancient Tibetan art forms symbolically representing a microcosm of the universe from the human perspective. This week-long creative collaboration culminates in a Gala celebration on September 26 at 6 p.m., that includes a champagne reception, an introduction of the project by student participants, a specially chosen short concert by the astonishing multi-Grammy Award-winner k.d. lang, a simple yet elegant dinner by influential chef Alice Waters, and a live auction—event proceeds to benefit Grace Cathedral and Tools for Peace. On September 27, there will be a dissolution ceremony for the mandalas performed at the II a.m. service. Cost: Viewing the creation and dissolution of the sand mandalas is free. \$50 for the reception, program, and concert on Saturday; \$250 also includes the dinner and auction. MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

A love of tradition has never weakened a nation, indeed it has strengthened nations in their hour of peril; but the new view must come, the world must roll forward. (Sir Winston Churchill, speech in the House of Commons, November 29, 1944)

In my previous message, I wrote about change coming to the Hill, and how we must prepare for it and decide how to respond to that change.

Three months later, your Membership has heard all the arguments in favor, and against, the physical and a operational changes being proposed at the Masonic Auditorium. Opponents and proponents have lobbied heavily to influence the NHA membership (and, indeed, the entire community). When the lobbying stopped, your Board debated the matter, and voted overwhelmingly against the Conditional Use Permit currently under consideration. A strongly worded letter, reflecting the Board's position, has been delivered to the Planning Commission.

We are advised that the Fairmont has disclosed plans for converting its tower into luxury condominiums. The San Francisco hospitality market has changed during recent years, rendering the Fairmont Nob Hill a luxury tourist destination, while the lucrative convention business has shifted to the trendier SOMA hotels. The plan calls for retaining and re-constructing the original Fairmont tower structure, plus building out amenities that will serve both transient and permanent

We look forward to a presentation by the Fairmont to the entire NHA membership, permitting the neighbors to see for themselves the proposed project, and have opportunity to make inquiries of those who will direct the project's execution.

After all facts are known, and all voices are heard, we will convene the Board again, to debate the matter, and decide on an official position. This position will be delivered to the Planning Commission for its consideration of the Fairmont's Conditional Use Permit application.

In closing, I wish everyone a peaceful San Francisco Summer.


