NOB HILL HOLIDAY TREES LIGHT UP NOVEMBER 30

CEREMONY WILL RING IN OFFICIAL START OF HOLIDAY SEASON ON NOB HILL

Herb Kritz and Elizabeth Woodall have generously donated \$2,500 towards the Huntington Park Holiday Lighting Fund, which will be used to upgrade the system to more efficient and consistent lighting.

The hill that is San Francisco's ambassador to the world will signal the start of the Christmas season Monday, November 30 when Supervisor David Chiu throws the switch on the Huntington Park Christmas tree at 6 p.m.

The Nob Hill Association and the Huntington Hotel have jointly sponsored the annual Dorothy Fritz Cope Tree Lighting Ceremony for years, making it one of San Francisco's oldest and most enduring traditions. The Nob Hill Association has been helping to keep Huntington Park beautiful since 1928.

The ceremony is a truly local event, embracing family and the city's can-do, pioneering spirit. In 1945, real state developer Eugene Fritz turned his Huntington Apartments into the Huntington Hotel, and five years later stunned the male-dominated industry by transferring ownership to his daughter, Dorothy Fritz. It was Dorothy Fritz's hard work that made the Huntington Hotel the must-stay address for generations of royalty, celebrity, and people with supremely good taste. Today, the ownership and operation of the landmark hotel remains in the hands of family members including Association Board members John Cope and Catherine MacMillan. It is the only hotel on Nob Hill not owned by a chain.

A no-host cocktail party celebrating the lighting will take place from 4:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. at the Big Four Restaurant of the Huntington Hotel. The San Francisco Girls Chorus will start singing carols at 5:30 p.m. The ceremony will be held rain or shine. In case of rain, festivities will be moved inside Grace Cathedral.

Apprehension, Gratitude, and Hope for the Holiday Season

The following headlines appeared on Wells Fargo's Monthly Economic Outlook:

August 2009 – The Recovery is beginning to take shape September 2009 – The Recovery will take time to build momentum October 2009 – The Recovery will be agonizingly slow

With the Dow (as of October 23) at around 10, 000, up 52% from 6,547 on March 9, we are happy that our portfolios are looking fuller, and anxious that this trend may not continue. In short, we are apprehensively optimistic.

In our own neighborhood, we are also apprehensively optimistic about Live Nation/Masonic Auditorium's request for a Conditional Use Permit. The outcome of this matter will affect every resident on Nob Hill. As such, I strongly recommend that all NHA members attend the upcoming Board of Appeals Hearing, December 9th, 5pm. City Hall, Room 416, One Dr. Carlton B. Goodlet Place. Your attendance matters!

While little appears to have happened in moving forward with our plans for the renovation and maintenance of Huntington Park, much activity is occurring behind the scenes. We are in the research phase for establishment of a Special Huntington Park Landscaping and Maintenance District, to be funded by the Nob Hill property owners. With the city reducing its Parks and Rec. budget annually, the community will ultimately bear responsibility for keeping our neighborhood centerpiece healthy and beautiful. This solution may be our best option in doing so; more information will be shared as it becomes available.

Grace Cathedral was recently the victim of a malicious and destructive de-facing of its historic east-facing bronze doors. Neighbors are horrified that such an act can occur on Nob Hill, reminding us that now, more than ever, we must be ever aware of our surroundings and what is happening around us, so please, invite your neighbors to join you when you go out for a stroll, and stay safe.

I cannot say enough about the herculean efforts around establishment of the Nob Hill Stimulus Plan, and the wonderful participation by our neighbor-businesses. There are many new Business Members who have joined the Association as a result of this program. Special thanks go out to Phil Alford (Community Events Chair), and Mary Kay McNulty (Membership Chair) for bringing enthusiastic member participation, and enabling all to benefit from this worthwhile campaign. Be sure to carry your NHA membership card with you; it is your invitation to save, when patronizing our NHA business members!

We are in the closing months of an historic year in our neighborhood. The change I described earlier this year has begun to affect the way we live on the Hill, and we can take heart in our ability make that change work for the betterment of our community. We joke about it, we worry about it, we question it, but our neighborhood and our friends are closer than we were just a couple of years ago. We appreciate being individuals, and we like sharing our ideas and concerns with others of similar interests.

And perhaps that may be the best message this Holiday Season....to unite as a community in order to become a model for the change to come, and to use the best in each of us to accomplish that goal. To all the members of the Nob Hill neighborhood, I send my warmest wishes for a happy and healthy 2009 Holiday Season.

Stephen Cornell and **Brownies Hardware** are perhaps two of San Francisco's greatest assets! Both were born and raised in San Francisco with an unwavering passion and love for everything San Francisco.

Stephen Cornell was born at Mt. Zion Hospital where at the time his family lived in Nob Hill. He matriculated through Redding Elementary School, James Denman Junior High School, and Lowell High School. He is married to Marilyn Brown and they have two children Chris and Lauren.

Through the years Stephen has nurtured a passion for all things San Francisco. He collects historic photographs and other printed memorabilia from San Francisco's glorious past, especially Polk Street history. His corner store window is dedicated to displaying old articles, ads, logos, and other historic memorabilia. If you have items you would like to contribute to this display, stop by the store to have your item photocopied (so you won't have to give up your precious keepsakes) and Stephen will be happy to include it in the window display.

Brownies Hardware was founded in fall 1905 by Edgar Brownstone, hence its name. In 1950, Stephen's father Leeland Cornell and his partner Fred Arndt took the business on, with Stephen being its third owner since 1974. All three owners believed in being active in the community and have served as president of the Polk Street Merchants Association several times.

When Stephen's father and his partner took over the business, there were only two partners and one employee. Now Brownies Hardware has one owner and over a dozen employees, who on the average have worked at Brownies for 9 years.

Brownies only hires San Francisco residents who are asked not to drive, but to only take public transportation to work. It provides full medical and dental, sick leave, and vacation benefits to its employees, while at the same time maintaining reasonable prices for all its products and services. It does not hire summer help, believing in hiring for the long-term and year-round. Stephen is proud of the fact they have not had to lay off anyone during this down-turn in the economy and is most grateful to all its customers —like you —for their continued patronage and support.
